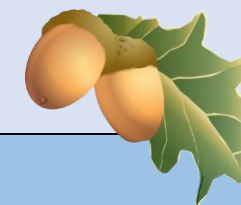
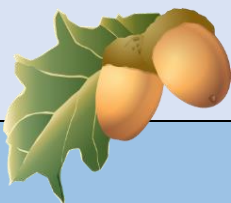


# Long Whatton C of E Primary School Sports Premium Review and Action Plan

### Evaluation of 2018-19 Sports Premium Funding impact

Activities and improvements during the year 2018/19

Over the last academic year, the children have been offered various opportunities to support development and improve confidence. The year 5 and 6 took part in the Brownlee triathlon which helped to build confidence and self-esteem. All the children were able to take part in Be-Skilled sports mornings in different schools which helped to promote teamwork, competition and sportsmanship. The children were able to get involved with sport at lunchtimes through the play leaders. Premier sports training for staff helped to deliver quality PE as well as morning Wakey Shakey. Staff have

	<p>been sent on forest school training so that more children can have the opportunity which has promoted mental well-being.</p> <p>The whole school has been able to take tennis lessons during the summer term which has enabled children to experience a new sport, learning new skills and techniques. During the winter and Autumn term, the children in years 1-5 have taken part in swimming lessons to gain water confidence and progress to new levels.</p> <p>New PE equipment and tools have been bought to help with the increasing class sizes and to support the outdoor activities within the forest school area which has been a great success and a wonderful learning opportunity for forest school and topic.</p>
Overall evaluation of impact on subject	Over the year, the children have learnt the importance of friendly competition and teamwork. They are beginning to see the relevance of PE and the benefits towards health both mentally and physically in the curriculum. They have had the opportunity to be involved in more local competitions which are accessible to all which has built confidence.
